Following a brief orientation, the volunteers deployed to pack 100 shoulder bags donated by **PNC Bank**, filling them with winter supplies from our cache of hand knit caps and scarves, T-shirts and toiletries. Within 3 hours, all 100 plus bags were packed, sorted by size and gender and staged for loading into the 'Miracles on Wheels' vans for delivery.
